Saint Elizabeth of Hungary Award

The Parents' Club, in support of the senior class, will annually present in May a cash award(s) (up to \$3000) to a graduating senior(s) at Mount DeSales Academy based on the student's commitment to service to recognize that senior who demonstrates the Christ-like actions of serving others.

The award is named after Saint Elizabeth of Hungary, who was of royal blood and could have lorded it over her subjects but instead she served them with such a loving heart that her brief life won for her a special place in the hearts of many. Applications will be evaluated based on the student's amount and level of involvement in supporting their school, parish, or community, as well as their expression of their motivation, commitment, or impact from their service in the required essay.

Applications must be submitted no later than April 29th to be eligible. **Under no circumstances will applications be accepted after the April 29th deadline.** Award will be presented at the senior award ceremony.

All questions must be answered, essay attached, and signed before the application will be accepted. Please be sure to include the number of hours for service activities. Service is defined using MDSA's service curriculum. The Parents' Club and MDSA reserve the right to publish the awardee's name and registered parish.
